Why Music Education?

Fighting Marginalization With Music

Providing access to inclusive, engaging music education is an essential and effective tactic to fight against marginalization. Why? Because frequent music education has been proven to improve language-related brain development and literarcy with greatest effect on students with the lowest level of achievement¹.

Music's Lasting Impact

Children who receive early and consistent musical instruction are the beneficiaries of profound advantages, both cognitive and social. The impact of these programs can be seen in the competence, confidence, and enrichment of these students' lives in ways that are at once substantive, enduring, and scientifically proven. We don't consider music to be a small piece of a well-rounded education, but rather an essential component to its holistic growth as a whole. We view music education as the key that unlocks long-lasting and meaningful change for our community, our country, and our world.

Immersive Music Challenge

The D'Addario Foundation's Newly Launched Initiative

We are challenging high-poverty schools to implement music-based mentoring programs to boost reading & math achievement, and improve the health of children & communities.



Immersive Music Challenge Why? Our Children Are Not Okay



Poor Reading underlies every form of social inequity, but this is a trend that has remained constant for 50 years².

This Immersive Music Challenge is a The Good News: powerful way to help kids attending high-poverty schools thrive.

In 2019, only 37% of 12th graders read proficiently¹.



In 2020, the pandemic made things worse, as anxiety, depression, and social isolation in children reached crisis levels³, and learning achievement plummeted⁴.

Immersive Music Challenge nspiration for the Chalenge

Inspired by the positive impact of after-school music-based mentoring within high-poverty schools in Long Beach Unified School District and the 40+ years of supporting immersive music education, the D'Addario Foundation has created a 3-Phase Immersive Music Challenge to help school districts, charter and parochial systems throughout the country implement music-based mentoring after school on their own high-poverty campuses.

In 2015, Long Beach Unified School District, the 4th largest in California, implemented after-school music-based mentoring in 5 high-poverty elementary schools to improve school safety. Students participated in 4+ hours per week of after-school ensemble music training and mentoring beginning in Grade 2. Not only did participating students thrive...

English +26 Points Math +17 Points

Students who participated in music-mentoring achieved significantly higher standardized scores in English language arts (+26 points) and math (+17 points)¹

The district responded by doubling the number of schools at which they provide after-school music-based mentoring.



Participating students with the lowest prior achievement showed the greatest gains (+39 points, English; +33 points, math)¹

Immersive Music Challenge

Three Phases

Total Raised: \$137,212

Phase One: Consultation, Collaboration, & Planning

Recruit a team of key consultants and advisors.

Develop an action plan & resources to support effective implementation of music-based mentoring programs on high-poverty campuses.

Recruit 5 or more school districts to participate in the Challenge for at least 5 years.

\$150K per year for 2 Years (\$300K total)

Phase Two: Multi-District Test of Concept (5 Years)

School districts participating will work with our consultants to launch effective music-based mentoring programs in high-poverty elementary schools.

Participating school districts will build sustainable programs by utilizing some of their existing funding streams to cover the cost of the program.

Our Evaluation team will capture impact measures and evaluate, publish and disseminate outcomes.

\$300K per year for 5 years (\$1.5M total)

If Phase Two findings are positive, we aim to build a national movement.

Phase Three: Expand the Challenge

Develop a new action plan to use the resources developed in Phase One, and refined in Phase Two, to inspire the implementation of music-based mentoring within high-poverty public, charter and parochial schools throughout the country. Engage school districts that successfully implement the program as Regional Mentor Districts.

Regional Mentor Districts will support the successful implementation of after-school music-based mentoring on high-poverty campuses in neighboring districts, and help participating districts participating districts capture progress and impact measures to facilitate ongoing evaluation and continuous quality improvement.

Girls in Nusic

Since its inception in 2018, we've raised over \$115K in support of our Girls in Music Initiative, created to help balance the tipped scales of gender in music by providing transformative education, resources, and mentorship to empower girls to thrive in both art and industry.

In 2022 alongside D'Addario & Co., we extended the celebration of International Women's Day (March 8th) to a five-day event. During that time, a portion of the purchase of any D'Addario product at Sam Ash, Heid Music, Strings by Mail, or Russo Music in-store or online was donated to the Girls in Music Initiative, and D'Addario matched 50% of the total donation. In addition, Sweetwater participated by making a generous monetary contribution.

Music Business Scholarship at Hofstra University

The Bridge Fund was established in 2022 and focuses specifically on bridging the gap between access to extraordinary after-school and in-school music programs and the black community which has been historically ignored and too often denied access to these life-changing programs.

Silent Auction

In November 2022, the D'Addario Foundation held a silent auction which raised \$13,460 in support of the newly established Immersive Music Challenge. Thanks to our industry partners & D'Addario artists, we were able to offer signed merch, gear & limited-edition instruments, and one-of-a-kind experiences such as a virtual lesson with Wilco drummer Glenn Kotche and a one-on-one with guitar aficionado Marty Schwartz for auction.

Players Circle

Through D'Addario & Co's rewards program, Players Circle, members can earn points just for buying D'Addario products. In addition to using points towards free D'Addario gear, members can now donate their points to the D'Addario Foundation.

In 2022, the D'Addario Foundation received \$8,384 in donations from 1,423 Players Circle members. So far in 2023, we've surpassed that amount and have received over \$16.400 from this initiative.

Terracycle

Since 2016, D'Addario & Co. has partnered with Terracycle to encourage the recycling of used instrument strings. That program has grown considerably with 11 million strings recycled to date.

For every 0.25 pounds of recycled instrument strings sent to Terracycle, they donate \$1 to the D'Addario Foundation. In 2022 and 2023, \$5,445 was contributed to the D'Addario Foundation as a result of Terracycle points being redeemed for donations.

International art world sensation Federico Uribe has been creating sculptural art out of everyday objects for years. Most recently Federico has created works out of the bits and pieces of instrument accessories. His most recent art was featured at Miami's Art Basel in the Adelson Galleries booth. Bamboo Landscape made from reeds, guitar strings, and violin pegs is for sale with 10% of the proceeds going to support the D'Addario Foundation.

Federico Uribe often says that children are his biggest fans. Without preconceived notions or prejudice about art, kids see his art for what it is and immediately understand it. Both Federico Uribe and the D'Addario family believe that incorporating art into children's lives expands their minds and brings the future generation closer together.

Since 2017, the D'Addario Foundation has partnered with Hungry for Music through instrument drives, assisting their network of repair technicians with product donations needed to properly service donated instruments, and collaborating to find homes for the thousands of instrument donations they receive & restore.

In 2023, the owner of two instrument rental companies in Connecticut reached out to the D'Addario Foundation with an extraordinary offer to donate 3,500+ school band & orchestra instruments to us & Hungry for Music.

Jeff Campbell, Hungry for Music's Founder & Director, worked tirelessly nearly every day, all day for weeks to get the donated instruments out of the warehouse they were stored at & safely relocated elsewhere, with the help of dozens of volunteers. These instruments are now being inventoried, assessed, repaired, and will ultimately be donated to students in need.
